Public Safety Director's Message

Wyoming Police Department

Citizens of Wyoming,

The following report is a snapshot of Wyoming Public Safety activity for 2014, an overview of our budgeting, crime statistics, personnel comparisons and patrol activities. The Public Safety employees are dedicated to serving our community and making it a better place to live and work; it is the quality of life here in Wyoming that brought us and keeps us in this amazing community.

Wyoming has caught some attention in 2014, from interest stories on programs we are doing, community policing and outreach activities, to a recent article written by Value Penguin ranking our community the 6th safest place in Minnesota for small communities between 5,000-10,000 people, and 7th overall for all cities in Minnesota. This is an impressive statistic considering we are a small community on the fringe of a major metropolitan area positioned on a couple of major traffic corridors like Interstate 35 between Minneapolis, St. Paul and Duluth in addition to the Highway 8 corridor to Wisconsin.

We at the City of Wyoming take great pride in these rankings; a demonstration of not only the partnerships and commitment your Public Safety providers have with our community but more importantly a representation of the caliber people who work and live in Wyoming.

Financial Summary

Wyoming Public Safety


At the beginning of each annual budget cycle we take a close look at the services and programs Public Safety provides our community. They are evaluated for effectiveness and relevance and either continued into the following year or eliminated altogether. This becomes the basis for our performance-based budgeting.

In 2014, Public Safety's budget was \$1,479,856 for Fire, Police and Emergency Management. We spent \$1,452,478, which was 98% of the anticipated budget.


The adjacent charts reflect actual budget expenditures against the annual budget, broken down into the four major categories of expenditures.




The actual / budgeted discrepancy in 2013 was related to an unexpected employee retirement in late 2013.

The Public Safety budget is supported by three revenue sources; programs, activities and taxes dollars. 91% of our budget is supported through levied tax dollars, 7% by programs and 2% by activities.


Wyoming receives \$103,590 in program revenues through Police Officer Standards Training reimbursements, State and Federal grants in addition to Fire and Police State Aid.

The Police State Aid is directed to the overall operations of the Police Department while the Fire State Aid is directed specifically to support the Fire Relief Association restricted retirement fund.


Revenues by activities are directly associated to functions the Police Department performs; such as running a department impound lot for abandoned vehicles and tows associated to arrest activity. Administrative and Ordinance Citations are activities associated by traffic enforcement and minor code violations rather than issuance of uniform traffic citations.


Staffing Levels Per 1,000 Residents



Staffing levels frequently raise questions on whether the department is over or understaffed. The attached charts demonstrate our current staffing levels as compared to similar sized communities around Minnesota and also our neighboring departments. We are operating with about 30% less officers than communities of similar size.

Staffing levels can be controversial. We regularly hear both sides of the argument that the Police Department either has too many or not enough police officers. To neutralize the argument we use a complex formula to determine how many officers we need assigned to our patrol functions to operate at a level that serves the public based on our specific community demands. The following factors are taken into consideration and calculated out to make the final determination on the number of needed officers to perform our patrol functions.

- Number of Part I crimes reported
- Number of Part II crimes reported
- Number of vehicle crashes reported
- Number of traffic stops conducted
- Total number of calls performed

Additionally we calculate in our patrol relief factors, which include:

- Vacation time
- Sick time
- Compensation time
- Overtime

The other elements which are taken into consideration are:

- Training time
- Other assignments


The final factor considered is the amount of time per hour we assign as unobligated time, this is the employee’s time invested in proactive policing. This includes the time patrolling neighborhoods, monitoring traffic in and around the neighborhoods, talking with local residents and business people, monitoring pedestrian traffic before and after school, time spent in the school and local businesses and other tasks.

All of these factors are added to a staffing module to help determine the needed employee hours to address the activities of our specific community. It’s from this module that we determine our staffing level needs. The chart above is a five year demonstration of our community needs as compared to our actual staffing levels for those employees assigned to the patrol functions. To efficiently and effectively address the policing needs of the community, both the demand and actual should be balanced. As the chart represents we have been operating at a staff level deficiency for the past five years.



Our total calls for Police Services were up 13% in 2014 for a total of 12,084 calls. As the Service by Type chart shows, over 9,700 calls for service that are not Part I, Part II or traffic related activity.

A significant part of an officer's shift is devoted to proactive interventions or community disputes that don't rise to the level of a crime.





Traffic Stops by Disposition




Traffic enforcement is an important element in providing Public Safety services. Our goal is to influence the behaviors of those driving in our community to ensure safe roadways. Officers have the discretion to determine the best disposition to effectively influence those driver’s behaviors when conducting traffic stops. The three options are: verbal warnings, administrative citations or a uniform traffic citation. Routine traffic stops often lead to additional criminal behavior discoveries with additional consequences, which may include arrest and/or vehicles being towed, as represented below.

Vehicles Towed by Reason




Wyoming Police had one officer assigned to Investigations in 2014. The responsibility of the position is to follow-up on all cases that did not reach disposition by our patrol officers. Traditionally these are more complex cases, which require additional personnel time and extensive follow-up to solve. There were 96 cases assigned to Investigations in 2014. The attached chart represents the percentage of cases assigned by type and below represents how those cases closed were dispositioned. Out of the 96 cases assigned to our investigator, all but two cases have been cleared and closed.


The Police Department relies on a group of 12 community volunteers that make up our Police Reserve Unit. They are individuals from all walks of life. They are unpaid and volunteer in their spare time to help with community events, do ride-alongs with officers, patrol the community as additional presences, perform our bike patrol functions and help officers on a number of community services calls. In 2014, these dedicated individuals volunteered 824 hours of their personal time to assist our department. The chart below represents how the 824 hours were allocated in 2014.




Training

A training program is an essential part of the success of our department. We must maintain and strive to improve on the necessary motor skills for performing our duties, meet state mandates and stay current with the frequently changing laws established by our legislators. In 2014, we spent \$8,150 on training our current employees, to include off-site courses, webinars, conferences, in-house refreshers and supplies for our range training. We only spent \$741 on average per employee for training and continued education fees.




Our first priority is to meet the state mandated training, which equates to about 46% of our total training budget and is done mostly in-house. The adjacent chart reflects staff time associated with the different training types.




2014 Part I Crimes




The second of two main categories of crime classes compose a universal crime classification system established for crime reporting purposes. Part II offenses are generally less serious in nature.


2014 Part II Crimes by Type





Part I crimes are a universal set of more serious crimes and occur most frequent and are traditionally a higher priority for law enforcement. These tabulations provide a count of "known offenses."






Crime Rate Clearance – A reported index offense can only be cleared through one of the following dispositions: arrest, summons complaint, unfounded or exceptionally cleared.

Arrest- Is the physical act of taking an individual into custody.

Summons /Complaint – Formal process of charging an individual with a crime without physically taking them into custody.

Unfounded – The index crime reported was determined not to be a criminal act.

Exceptionally Cleared – Based on some element beyond law enforcement’s control that precludes the placing of criminal charges.




All other index offenses remain open and unsolved cases until one of the above dispositions is reached.

Crime Rate – The number of index offenses reported for each unit of population, per 100,000 persons. Crime rates are computed for communities with varying populations by dividing the number of index crimes by the population and multiplying the result by 100,000. This is the national standard for computing the Crime Index per community, establishing a consistent value of reporting regardless of community size or population.



The State wide crime index is used as part of our crime trending. We compare our index from year to year and also against the State wide average and the 10th District Court which we are part of. The snapshot reveals an increase in our Part I crimes from 2013 to 2014, which are our more serious crimes.

In 2014 there were 30 incidents statewide involving in the line of duty firearms discharge incidents and Wyoming Police Department was one of those agencies. On July 2, 2014, Wyoming Police Officers were confronted by an armed suspect while conducting a traffic stop. The armed suspect refused to follow the commands of officers in an attempt to disarm him during a stand-off. Rather than resorting directly to the use of deadly force, Wyoming Police Officers made the decision to utilize our less than lethal munitions. Officers fired five rounds of less than lethal munitions from a department shotgun, disarming and wounding the individual.

The armed individual was arrested, charged and convicted on felony level charges.





3 Year Trending of Total Calls




As our community grows and becomes more active, the call volume increases. You will see that over the last few years the types of calls have changed in the next few graphs.



3 Year Trend for (Non EMS) calls




2014 Personnel Cost


2014 Personnel Costs by Service Type

Monthly Activity Overview




