

- a) The east side Highway 61 / Forest Boulevard from 240th Street to 257th Street.
- b) County Road 30 / Forest Boulevard from 270th Street to the north border of the city, and to not extend past the right-of-way of I-35.
- c) The entire length of County Road 36 / 295th Street within the city.
- d) County Road 22 / East Viking Boulevard from the Anoka County border to the I-35 interchange.
- e) East Viking Boulevard where it turns north at Glen Oak Drive to the east border of the city.
- f) The future extension of Innsbrook Avenue as shown on the Comprehensive Plan map.
- g) The entire length of US Highway 8 within the city.
- h) County Road 22 / Wyoming Trail from Goodview Avenue to the east border of the city.
- i) Kettle River Boulevard from the Anoka County border to 261st Street, and to not extend past the right-of-way of I-35.
- j) 250th Street between I-35 and Highway 61.

5. Ordinance Amendment Snowmobile and Off-Road Vehicle Ordinance

Weck explained how the ordinance was separated to regulate snowmobile and off-road vehicle use in two separate Articles.

After discussion of Sec. 34 – 137, (1), (a), and Sec. 34 – 137, (2) regarding the operation of snowmobiles on streets and restricted hours for operation; and Sec. 34 – 139, (1) regarding posted automobile speed limits being applicable to snowmobiles; the Commission requested that Police Chief Hoppe review the sections and how they would be enforced.

Following further discussion the commissioners made the following observations and changes to the ordinance:

- 1) Remove “unless specifically posted” from Sec. 34 – 137, (6) and 34 – 149, (5).
- 2) Add applicable statutes to Sec. 34 – 141 for persons under 18 operating snowmobiles.
- 3) Remove ATV from Sec. 34 – 142 (5).
- 4) Remove “or off-road vehicle” from Sec. 34 – 146 (2), (c).
- 5) Add applicable statutes to Sec. 34 – 153 for Recreational Motor Vehicles other than ATV’s.
- 6) Questioned adding a minimum crown diameter to the coniferous tree dust control screen requirement in Sec. 158, (2), (b), 1.
- 7) Questioned when licensing is required for motorized scooters and skateboards.
