

Wondering what to do about your Leaves?

You can bring all your leaves and grass clippings and brush up to 3" diameter to the Area Compost site in Lindstrom. They are open Wednesdays 2pm to 7pm and Saturdays 9am to 4pm. (Until Dusk in fall.) Officials operating the Compost Site remind the Public that the Composting Site is closed during Inclement/rainy weather to protect the access roads with in the Site. (During prolonged or wet weather persons have been stuck at this site.) They are open till Saturday November 16th, 2013.

Leaf Burning is prohibited in the City of Wyoming. Please don't rake leaves into the street. Leaves can enter storm drains and cause flooding.



It's about getting to be that time of the year again...SNOW!!

The City of Wyoming will be enforcing winter parking and snow removal regulations. All vehicles are prohibited from parking on city streets and alleys from **2am to 12pm between November 1st to April 1st**. Failure to comply will result in a citation or tow of vehicle.

Shoveling Public Sidewalk

According to City Ordinances, homeowners are responsible for removing all snow and ice from public side-walks in front of their homes within (24) hours after a snowfall. Failure to do so could result in injury to the public as well as a violation of City codes.

Plowing Snow Across Roads

The pushing of snow across roadways is against city and state law.

Large collections of snow in roadways could create conditions that are dangerous to public safety and could cause damage to snowplow equipment and possible injuries to snow plow drivers. Accidents and damages caused by snow piles left in the roadway may result in liability to the property owner.

Winter is approaching and the public works department would like to remind all residents to place their trash receptacle at the end of your driveway and not in the right-of-way.

Just a Friendly Reminder

Please DO NOT flush dental floss, paper towels, shoptowels, diapers, wipes or rags. These items tend to get caught in service lines, main sewer lines, and/or life station pumps and may cause damage or even cause costly sewer backups. ONLY toilet paper should be disposed of in the sanitary sewer.

Utility Billing Options

- EBILLING-start getting your bill delivered automatically via secured email.
- EPAYMENT-sign up allows residents to have their payment directly debited from a checking or savings account on the payment due date.
- For Convenience the Call Center-has extended hours Monday-Friday 8am-9pm CALL 651-255-0971. They can assist move-in & move-outs, can schedule service orders, and have the ability to take payments over the phone,
- Payments can either be mailed in the return envelope provided with your bill or they can be dropped off at city hall.


