This fall the City of Wyoming is featuring our *Hawk Meadows Park Nature Trail*. The trail welcomes nature enthusiasts, hikers and families. Sights along the trail include beaver ponds, beautiful willow trees and wetlands.

### ***Wondering what to do about your Leaves?***

You can bring all your leaves and grass clippings and brush up to 3” diameter to the Area Compost site in Chisago City. The facility is located at 31501 Lofton Avenue. They are open Wednesdays 2:00pm to 7:00pm, Saturdays 9:00am to 4:00pm and Sundays 1:00pm to 4:00pm (until dusk in the Fall). Officials operating the Compost Site remind the Public that the Composting Site is closed during inclement/rainy weather to protect the access roads within the site (during prolonged or wet weather persons have been



stuck at this site). **The compost facility will be closing for the season on Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019.**

### *A Message from the Fire Department*

Hi Wyoming,

Fall is always a busy time for the Fire Department. We now have Stagecoach Days in the rear view mirror, and we have our Firefighter Banquet coming up on Oct 26<sup>th</sup>. Fire Prevention week is coming up (Oct 7<sup>th</sup> -11<sup>th</sup>). We will be visiting the Elementary school again on Wednesday Oct 9<sup>th</sup>, and we will be having our annual Open house that evening as well. This year's Fire Prevention theme is "Not Every Hero wears a cape. Practice your escape." We encourage each household to talk as a family about an escape plan to get out of your residence and then practice that escape route.

With Fall comes cooler temps and the need to heat your house. Please make sure that you have working Smoke Detectors and CO alarms. If you use a wood burning fireplace for heat, please have your chimney's inspected and cleaned.

### *Winter Reminders from the Public Works Department*

- The City of Wyoming will be enforcing winter parking and snow removal regulations. All vehicles are prohibited from parking on city streets and alleys, until the snow is plowed, from **2:00 am to 12:00 pm between November 1st to April 1st**. Failure to comply with the City's winter parking and snow removal regulations will result in a citation or the towing of the vehicle.
- Place trash receptacles at the end of your driveway, not in the roadway.
- Mail boxes damaged during snow removal will be evaluated case by case. If it is damaged by City equipment, Public Works will install a temporary post and will install a permanent post in spring.
- Plowing snow across roadways is unlawful and against State Law. Accidents and damages caused by snow piles left in the roadway may result in liability to the property owner.
- The Fire Department asks residents to shovel out fire hydrants near their homes. Keeping hydrants clear of snow can substantially reduce the time it takes firefighters to put out a fire.
- According to City Ordinances, homeowners are responsible for removing all snow and ice from public side-walks in front of their homes within (24) hours after a snowfall. Failure to do so could result in injury to the public as well as a violation of City ordinances.
